General Information

The conference will be held at Invercauld House, the functions and conference facility of Southern Cross University in Lismore, northern New South Wales. Lismore is a city of about thirty thousand people, with another ten thousand living in the surrounding rural area and villages. It is the largest urban centre in the Northern Rivers Region of New South Wales, and is replete with motels, restaurants, banks, hospitals and medical services, car-hire services and other facilities befitting its status as the regional capital.

There is a direct air service four times daily between Lismore and Sydney, operated by Regional Express. Nearby Ballina Airport (east, 30 min. drive) also has flights to and from Sydney, per Jetstar. Gold Coast Airport (north, 1hr drive) services many Australian and some New Zealand cities. Brisbane (north, 2hr drive) has a major domestic and international airport.

Lismore has a sub-tropical climate, with peak rainfall in February/March and peak temperatures in December to February. On the other hand, the weather in June, conference time, is typically mild, with a mean maximum (daytime) temperature of 20°C and a mean minimum (night-time) temperature of 8°C. Rainless days are usual in June, but wet weather not unknown.
